**BACKGROUND/PREVIOUS BOARD ACTIVITY**

The Consolidated Application (ConApp) is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to county offices, school districts, and direct-funded charter schools throughout California. Annually, each Local Educational Agency submits the spring release of the application to document participation in these programs and provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs. This is a separate funding source from the Local Control Accountability Plan.

The Board previously approved the Consolidated Application on June 22, 2016.

**DISCUSSION**

Lake County Office of Education applies for funding through Title I Part A (Basic Grant), Title I Part D (Facilities Report At-Risk Programs), and Title II Part A (Educator Quality).

**FISCAL, STAFFING, AND FACILITIES**

Title Programs provide substantial funding to county-run programs including Instructional Aides, professional development, and conferences.
