- **We serve** 2500 students through the *Healthy Start* programs and services, removing barriers and helping students succeed.
- **We provide** appropriate alternative education settings for students at the *Lake County Court and Community Schools*.
- **We provide** leadership and technical support for the county's districts in public school accountability, improving teaching and learning, and new teacher and administrator support.
- **We serve** 1200 students studying career/technical subjects distributed through the 5 comprehensive high schools.
- **We serve** 450 students for counseling and 2500 students for prevention programs through our *Safe Schools/Healthy Students* programs.
- We serve approximately 250 children through the Early Connection Preschools, and nearly 300 children through the Kid Connection After School Programs.



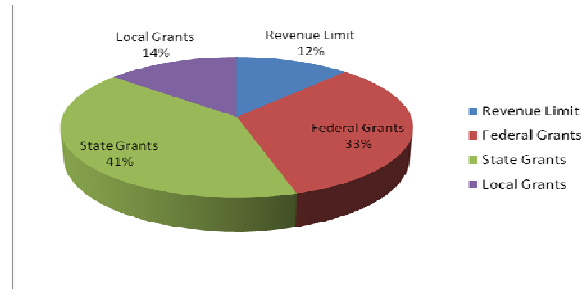
